### 2 BUSINESS ARISING

2.01 School Site in High River

Trustee Van Donzel said that High River Town Council and Senior Administration met with Christ the Redeemer School Board in January where future school sites were discussed. One of the sites which is readily available is a 10-acre site located within Montrose. CTR Catholic indicated their preference for 15 acres. Executive Assistant Brunette received an email from the Town asking if CTR Catholic would be sharing the site with Foothills School Division and what type of school CTR Catholic wanted to build.

Associate Superintendent Kilcommons followed up with an Associate Superintendent of Foothills School Division (FSD) who expressed that FSD does not have an interest in the proposed site in Montrose. Mr. Kilcommons proposed to the Board a change in grade configurations for Holy Spirit Academy (K to Grade 4) and Notre Dame Collegiate (Grade 5 to 8), allowing for a Grade 9 to 12 school on the new site. Discussion followed. Trustee de Jong loves the plan of a middle school and felt it would be great for High River. Trustee Van Donzel noted that this is the configuration of the public schools in High River. Mr. Kilcommons will follow up with the Town of High River on CTR Catholic's plans and will unofficially share with Capital Planning that there is a potential school site in High River.

## 3 THREE YEAR EDUCATION PLAN

3.01 New Format for Three Year Education Plan

Superintendent Dr. Morrison reported that new rules indicate school divisions will no longer be allowed to combine their Annual Education Results Report with the Three-Year Education Plan. However, school divisions are allowed one last cycle this November to combine reports. Dr. Morrison stated CTR Catholic will not alter the Three-Year education plan in November 2020, because a new Three-Year Education Plan will be presented in May 2021. Trustees were all in favour of Dr. Morrison's plan.

Dr. Morrison reviewed a template for the new Three-Year Education Plan with trustees and asked for their feedback. Trustees thought that the plan was user friendly and well laid out. Dr. Morrison discussed the faith goals from the faith surveys that CTR Catholic sends out to parents, students, and staff. Director of Catholic Education, Lindsay Fagan, would like to slightly change a few questions on the faith survey. To this end a committee would be formed and recommendations would come back to the Board for approval.

## 10 ALBERTA SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION

10.01 ASBA Zone 5 Report

Trustee Keenan reported that ASBA Zone 5 met on June 5<sup>th</sup> and highlighted the following:

- Alberta Education representative reported that work continues on the relaunch plans.
- The Spring General Meeting was a success despite a few technical issues.
- ASBA will provide further recommendations to advocate for vaping and the Tobacco Act.
- Reminder to school boards that their ward structure must be passed before December 31<sup>st</sup> in accordance with the Education Act.
- ASBA is providing ongoing requests to the government asking that they assist school boards with insurance premiums across the province.
- ASBA held a meeting with Calgary Board of Education to understand the concerns and challenges they are facing.
- The Edwin Parr nominee for Zone 5 is from the Calgary Catholic School District.

10.02 Vote on Approval of Rural Caucus of Alberta School Boards 2020-2021 Budget Chair Schreiber stated that the Rural Caucus of Alberts School Boards expect costs of meetings to go down and therefore so will the fees for each board. Mr. Schreiber stated that the Rural Caucus has asked for a motion to affirm the budget from each Board. Discussion followed on approving the budget and remaining part of the rural caucus. Trustees view belonging to the caucus as very valuable and a good relationship building opportunity. Therefore,

## 11 DIVISION

11.01 Superintendents' Reports

Associate Superintendent Moss reported on wrapping up the school year as distance learning concludes. They are planning for the three scenarios of reentry with a focus on the health and safety of students and staff. Mrs. Moss reviewed CTR Catholic's Re-Entry Plan in detail with trustees as follows:

- General building safety
- Screening
- Responding to an illness
- Physical distancing
- Cohorting
- Masks
- Expectations for drop off and pick up of students
- Transportation
- Visitors and Volunteers at schools
- Student belongings and school supply lists
- Lunch, hot lunch, and the breakfast program
- Extra curricular activities
- Classroom learning
- Support for students with special needs
- Moving scenarios learning together online and in class
- Diploma Exams and Provincial Achievements Tests

Questions from trustees included sanitization of mobile computer labs and sensory rooms, a possible increase in custodial staff, rigor of academic learning, and competitive sports. Mrs. Moss referred to the FAQs on CTR Catholic's website to which they prepared answers to questions they felt parents would ask. Discussion followed on Boards' liability issues and legal advice that CTR Catholic has received.

Associate Superintendent Behm reported on the following:

- Mr. Behm reviewed a letter sent to CTR Catholic's staff about their re-entry reassuring them that the division is mitigating risks for their health. Mr. Behm mentioned that he had a positive meeting with some members of the ATA local on the back to school plans and staff safety considerations.
- Mr. Behm gave a staffing update on teachers hired for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Mr. Behm reviewed the New Teacher Orientation agenda, which is moving from three days to two. Induction sessions have also moved from three days to two and will likely be hosted in Brooks as over half of CTR Catholic's new teachers reside there.

Associate Superintendent Kilcommons reported on the following:

- Mr. Kilcommons reminded trustees that per diems and out of pocket reimbursements must be submitted as soon as possible.
- Mr. Kilcommons provided an update on the establishment vote in Oyen taking place today where they will require a quorum of 21 to be successful.
- Mr. Kilcommons stated that significant challenges are presenting themselves with the construction of the new École Good Shepherd School gymnasium. Mr. Kilcommons is in the process of obtaining factual evidence to present to Capital Planning on the challenges and extra costs as it is anticipated the gymnasium cannot be built within the budget provided.
- Mr. Kilcommons reviewed capital maintenance and renewal projects that CTR Catholic is working on from the government's work stimulus monies.
- Mr. Kilcommons reported that he received a letter last week informing the division that the Calgary Board of Education has petitioned to annex additional areas south of Calgary that have been formed by both Foothills School Division and CTR Catholic. Similarly,

Superintendent Dr. Morrison received an email from the Superintendent of Calgary Catholic asking if CTR Catholic would support giving up the formed area in question. A lengthy discussion on this issue followed. The Board was not comfortable with giving up formed territory and there was no motion made to do so as a result. The Board would like to further explore processes, consequences, and implications related to how formed areas are designated to divisions. As a starting point, it was decided that Dr. Morrison would reach out to Calgary Catholic's Superintendent and Mr. Kilcommons would reach out to Alberta Education advising them that CTR's Board is not comfortable with granting this request at this time. Further, Dr. Morrison is to advise his counterpart in Calgary Catholic that this discussion should occur at the Board level.

Superintendent Dr. Morrison reported on the following:

- Changes to funding for The Centre for Learning@HOME online students.
- Dr. Morrison shared graduation mass and commencements you tube links for upcoming CTR Catholic graduations.
